We, the undersigned, Electors of President and Vice-President of the United States of America for the State of Virginia, do hereby appoint

M. A. Hutchinson

to take charge of and forthwith deliver to the President of the Senate of the United States of America, at the seat of government in the City of Washington, in the District of Columbia, one of the certificates of the votes cast by the undersigned for President and Vice-President of the United States of America, on the second Monday in January, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.

In case there shall be no President of the Senate at the seat of government on the arrival of the said messenger, he shall deliver the said certificate into the office of the Secretary of State of the United States of America, to be safely kept and delivered over as soon as may be to the President of the Senate of the United States.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, we have hereunto signed our names, at the Capitol, in the City of Richmond, in the said State of Virginia, this twelfth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and in the one hundred and forty-ninth year of the Commonwealth and of the Independence of the United States of America.
