The Petition of Isaac Campbell humbly represents, that your
Petitioner by the Orders of Col^o. William Preston, recruited a Company
of light Horse, consisting of thirty five Men exclusive of Officers
in the County of Montgomery, for the Defence of that County &
the Frontiers of this State, which Orders were communicated to
his Excellency the Governour, and approved of by him. Your
Petitioner further sheweth that he was on constant Duty in
suppressing the Insurgents not only of this State but in
Carolina, that each Man found his own Arms & Horse.
Your Petitioner therefore prays that this Honourable House
would make them just Satisfaction for their Service as is
reasonable & just.
