Whereas it appears by the returns ^{received from} the Commissioners appointed for the ~~the~~ Counties of this Commonwealth, the Cities of Richmond & Williamsburg, the Borough of Norfolk ~~and~~ Town of Petersburg, to superintend the election of Electors to choose a President ~~and~~ Vice President of the United States, that a majority of the votes polled at the said election, were given in favor of the persons named below, — Therefore I Thomas W. Gilmer, Governor, have thought fit to issue this Proclamation, making known to all whom it may concern, that
