of ad quod damnum, which would issue. To avoid this exp-
-ense, and to produce a Concert in the direction of the Route,
Yours Petitioners pray that the County Courts of Albemarle,
Shelton, and Staunton, be may be authorized to appoint one
Commissioner for each County, to lay out the said Road
and assess the damages, & also upon the Report of the
said Commissioners, to open the Road by a competent num-
-ber of hands. -
