That said Wm Brooke dec^d their father en-
- listed in Lee's Legion in the War of the Revo-
- lution for the War, and continued to serve in
that capacity to the end of the War - They
have heretofore presented their claim to
His Excellency Govt. Taywell for an
allowance of land bounty for the said
services of said William Brooke - and
laid before him a letter from Genl. M^r
Donald of Baltimore who was a private
in the same Legion, addressed to your petition
and also the affidavit of Jacob Gideon
who belonged to the same Legion, and on
the examination of their claim it appeared
that the aforesaid substantially set forth the
same facts as stated by the above named
witnesses - But the bounty land was not
allowed to your petitioners - He therefore pray
that his case may be taken into consid-
- eration by your Hon^{ble} bodies, and that the regis-
- ter of the Land Office may be authorized
by law to issue Warrants for the land bounty
now claimed for the services of said Wm Brooke
as a Serg^t for the War - and he will ever
- remain
- He refers to a copy of the
Report of the Compt^r - which he prays
may be taken as reference to the origi-
- al papers filed in Lee's office (1805) -
