The Petition of Richard Alcock and Samuel Franklin
Impulors of Tobacco at Sanders Ware House in the
County of Amherst, Respectfully sheweth, that your
Petitioners at this time only receive the small Salary
of One Hundred fifty dollars of Annum for their
services, which your petitioners conceive is inadequate
to the services which they perform and the risk which
they run; Your petitioners further state that in
the year 1805 they rec^d at the afores^d Ware House
576 Hhd^s of Tob^o and in 1806 they rec^d 585, and
paid into the treasury the surplus duty thereon -

Your petitioners further state that the sum of
Two Hundred Dollars is allowed by Law to each
of the Impulors at all the Neighbouring Ware Houses
where they do not receive a greater quantity of
Tobacco than your petitioners - Your petitioners therefore
hope that your Hon^{ble} body will take these

Case into Consideration and allow them ~~from~~
the sum of two hundred doll^s. ~~annum~~, and
in duty bound they will ever prey
