

At a Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery continued and held for the County of Amherst at the Court House on Thursday the 24th day of September 1845.

William T. Simmons produced an account against the Commonwealth amounting to twenty five dollars and two cents verified by affidavit, and it appearing to the Court by satisfactory evidence that an extra guard was necessary to convey the prisoner Thomas D. Mahon to the penitentiary the Court doth allow the same and order that it be certified to the Auditor of Public Accounts.

The said account is in these words.

For my allowance for travelling 136 miles from the County of Amherst employed as extra guard by the Sheriff of said County to convey Thomas D. Mahon a convict to the Penitentiary at 4 cents per mile.	\$	5.44

For my services 13 ^{1/2} days computed at the rate of \$1.00 for every twenty miles coming and returning.	3	14.14
Ferriage of toll coming and returning

William T. Simmons employed as extra guard by the Sheriff of Amherst County to assist in the conveyance of a convict to the Penitentiary, this day personally appeared before me, the undersigned, Auditor of Public Accounts, (duly authorized to administer oaths in such cases) and made oath that the foregoing account is accurate and just.
